

InDesign Image in Text

1. Type the text you would like your image inside of. Use a thick font and a large point size. We used AYT Genuine 100 pt here.

2. Highlight the word with the **Text tool**. Select **Process Color Photo** or **B&W Photo** in the **Swatches palette** to allow **Picture Placer** to place the photo. If you plan to use **File/Place**, change the fill to **None**. Leave a black stroke around the text.



3. Select the text box with the **Selection Tool**. From the **Type menu**, choose **Create Outlines**. This will turn the text into a graphic that is no longer editable.



4. Click the **Picture Placer** button on the **YearTech toolbar**. Choose the photo you want to go inside your text. The word will display as an oval in **Picture Placer**, but will place your image inside the word.



5. Use the **Direct Selection tool** (white arrow) to position your image within the text.

To put a different photo in each letter, create a separate text box for each letter and convert it to outlines. Follow these same steps for each letter.
